The University of Southern Mississippi Committee on Services and Resources for Women is calling for submissions of essays for the annual Kathanne W. Greene Essay Competition.

The competition, honoring Southern Miss associate professor of political science Dr. Kate Greene, is open to male and female Southern Miss students in all disciplines. Submissions must focus on gender issues relevant to women's studies and are due by Monday, March 2. Essays may be submitted by the student or by a faculty member who wants to nominate a student paper.

A prize of \$200 will be awarded for an undergraduate and graduate paper. Undergraduate submissions must be 8-15 pages in length, while graduate papers must be 15-20 pages. Papers must be sole-authored, have a removable title page that includes the author's name, contact information and how they learned about the prize. No identifying markers should appear in the body of the paper.

Winning authors will be notified March 9 and recognized at an awards ceremony March 31 in conjunction with Women's History Month.
