## Featuring Helen Lefkowitz Horowitz

Sydenham Clark Parsons Professor at Smith College

Dr. Horowitz is currently the Sydenham Clark Parsons Professor at Smith College. Her 2002 *Rereading Sex: Battles over Sexual Knowledge and Suppression in Nineteenth-Century America* was the winner of the Merle Curti Award, 2003, for the best book in social and cultural history, and was one of two finalists for the Francis Parkman Prize of the Society of American Historians, and was one of three finalists for the Pulitzer Prize in History. In addition to *Rereading Sex*, she is the author of the following books: *Culture and the City*, *Alma Mater*, *Campus Life*, and *The Power and Passion of M. Carey Thomas*.
