1) Cover page with name, department, status (faculty, staff, and/or graduate student), award type (research and/or conference), address, and USM e-mail address.

*****Students applying must be employed by USM and required to do research in their employment OR have a faculty mentor from USM who agrees to receive and distribute the funds. Include either a statement of working for USM with a research component included or the name, email, phone, and fax of your faculty mentor.*****

Do not put identifying information on any other page.

2) Proposal of 1000 total words or less. Write to a general audience (no jargon).

- Research proposals should include: background, research questions and/or hypotheses, participants, methodology, and how it relates to issues of importance to/for/about women. If IRB approval is required, please specify the timeline for completing IRB.
- Requests for conference travel should include the details of the proposed project presentation. Include: name and nature of the conference, importance of the conference to your discipline, summary of your research project and how it relates to issues of importance to/for/about women.
- Professional development proposals should include the details of the development activity, how it relates to current position, and expected benefits.

Note: Funds are competitively awarded - Please provide sufficient detail to allow the committee adequate information to review your proposal.

3) Budget and budget justification (include any current or pending support if applicable).
