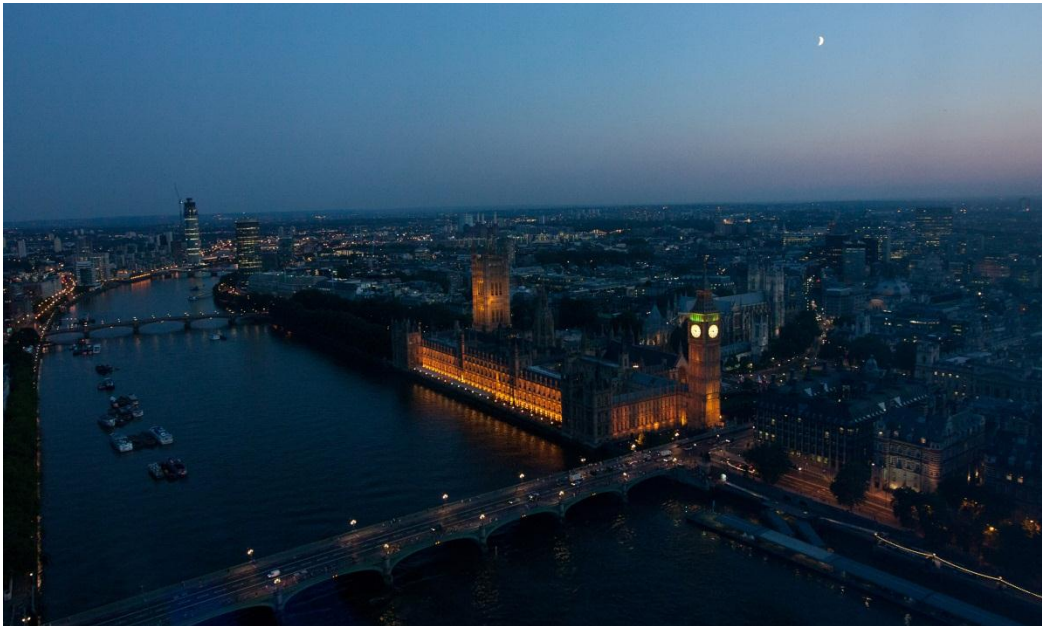
Coliseum:
