Gunter Library Community Service Project

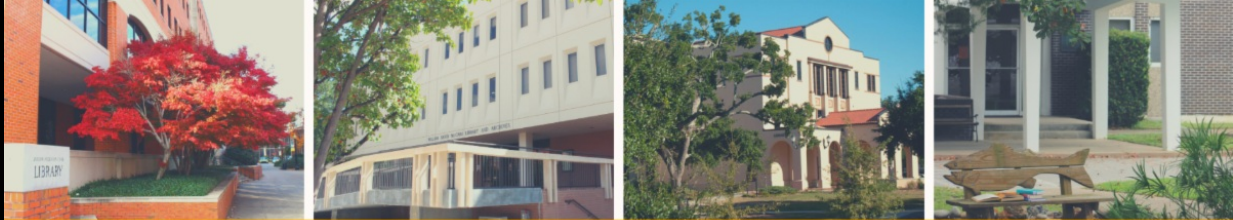
