

New works are added to the Public Domain on January 1 each year as their copyright expires. As of January 1, 2022, anything published in the U.S. prior to 1927 is in the Public Domain.

Payne Library Fellowship

This is a grant-funded position supported by the Jimmy A. Payne Foundation and provides an opportunity for recent graduates of the Southern Miss MLIS program to supplement their academic knowledge with real-world experience. The fellows may provide live or asynchronous information literacy instruction, in-depth research consultations, or basic reference assistance at a service desk, as well as participate in collection development. The fellow will have opportunities to use the LibApps platform from Springshare, including LibGuides, LibAnswers, and LibInsight, as well as the Primo discovery service and Alma library management system from Ex Libris. The fellow will work as a member of the Research Services Unit under the supervision of a faculty librarian, thus gaining a greater understanding of the expectations of a tenure-track position in an academic library.
