# Call for Papers

## Eligibility Requirements

To submit to *Catalyst*, your research must have been conducted during a full-time or part-time undergraduate study at The University of Southern Mississippi. Only current undergraduate students are allowed to submit papers for consideration.

Your submission must be completed and mailed according to the submission guidelines.

## Submission Guidelines

Submissions must fall into one of these categories:

1. Original Research—ranging from the traditional (but exceptionally researched) term paper to creative, original projects in the arts and sciences.
2. Art Work for Cover Consideration—photographs of art work may be submitted for this issue's cover. If you are submitting art work, you will also need to submit a 5-7 page commentary on the piece to be published in the issue on whose cover it appears.

Articles submitted must follow an established style manual (MLA, APA, etc.). The style used must be indicated on the application sheet. Submissions for original research must fall between 10-20 pages, double spaced, size 12 font, 1" margins. This page limit does not include references/sources. Full-length Honors theses are NOT accepted; however, you may submit a portion of your thesis so long as it complies with the above page restrictions. Due to the limits of journal publication, longer articles may need to be edited after selection.
