# University Archives Partners with Downtown Hattiesburg Association on Black History Month Project

Faculty and staff in University Archives recently assisted the Downtown Hattiesburg Association with the production of window exhibits to commemorate Black History Month. The exhibit was on display through the end of February in the front windows of the building that once housed the Kress Department Store, located at 500 North Main Street.

The window exhibits featured images from the Mississippi Civil Rights Movement, along with political campaign memorabilia of Black Mississippians who sought elected office, as well as material from University Archives' Oseola McCarty collection.

### **SMIRC Keynote Speaker and Presenters**

The Southern Miss Institutional Repository Conference (SMIRC) will take place virtually on April 29 and 30. SMIRC consists of speakers, panel discussions, and workshops that will address topics ranging from the basics of IRs to new ideas for longtime IR managers.



Serving as the keynote speaker is Sara Rouhi, Director of Strategic Partnerships at the Public Library of Science (PLOS), where she focuses on developing new business models for sustainable, inclusive open access publishing. In 2020 she launched PLOS's first collective action business model for highly selective publishing, PLOS Community Action Publishing, and has solicited over 50 partners from across the globe including consortia like the Big Ten Academic Alliance, Jisc, and CRKN. Her partnerships focus on collaborating with mission-aligned organizations to further PLOS' open science work in an equitable and inclusive way.

Which talent would you most like to have? Artistic talent.


**Most prized possession?** A tiny pair of salt and pepper shakers once owned by my great grandmother.
