NEWS FROM UNIVERSITY LIBRARIES AT SOUTHERN MISS

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS EARNS GRANT FOR PRESERVATION WORK



The important work of providing access to historical material in Special Collections is getting a boost through grant support from the National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC), a statutory body affiliated with the National Archives and Records Administration. The NHPRC's mission is promotion of the preservation and use of the country's documentary heritage essential to understanding the nation's democracy, history, and culture.

The grant - \$135,828 from NHPRC, with \$70,178 inkind matching funds from the University to increase access to collections - will support processing,

digitization, and development of finding aids for existing collections significant to the history and culture of Mississippi. Select material will be digitized and featured in online presentations.
