DE GRUMMOND CURATORSHIP MATCHING GIFT CHALLENGE

In support of the de Grummond Children's Literature Collection, the de Grummond Curatorship Endowment initiative was launched to support the curator and preserve, promote, and grow the collection with an unprecedented goal of \$2 million. This endowment will provide \$80,000 annually in discretionary support to fund travel to conferences significant in children's literature, sponsorship of a children's literature clinic featuring authors and illustrators, development of traveling exhibits, and collection acquisitions.

In early 2024, an anonymous donor came forward to help reach this goal. If \$1 million in gifts can be raised collectively for the Curatorship Endowment, the donor has agreed to match that support with a \$1 million gift of their own. This matching gift opportunity is only available through December 31, 2024.



SPECIAL COLLECTIONS PROCESSES COLLECTIONS THROUGH NHPRC GRANT

Through the National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC) grant, Special Collections has completed the processing of two more collections, the <u>O'Keefe Family Archive</u> and the <u>Sheila Michaels collection</u>.

The O'Keefe family archive shares the family's stories through both physical and digital items that include awards, scrapbooks, family history, business, and political content from various members of the O'Keefe family. The Sheila Michaels collection consists of her writing and publications, including travel diaries, photographs, and other personal memorabilia.

Collections previously processed through the grant include the Raylawni Branch collection, the Susan Hasalo Sojourner collection, the Harvey Edward West collection, and the Sheila Michaels papers.

The purpose of the grant, which concludes this month, is to increase access to collections and support processing, digitization, and development of finding aids for existing collections significant to the history and culture of Mississippi.
