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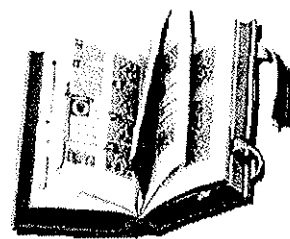
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Mississippi Department of Archives and History Manuscript Collection

BARKSDALE FAMILY PAPERS, ACCRETION. ca. 1960-1998. 0.33 c.f.

This accretion to the papers of the Barksdale family of Jackson, Mississippi, consists primarily of correspondence between Emily Woodson Barksdale Humphrey and her sister, Therese Hawkins Barksdale of Chapel Hill, North Carolina. Also included are an occasional photograph and program, social papers, and materials relating to family history. Presented by Therese Hawkins Barksdale Vinsonhaler, Chapel Hill, North Carolina.

CLARK (CHARLES) PAPERS, ACCRETION. ca. 1968-1973. 7.50 c.f.

This accretion to the papers of Charles Clark of Jackson, Mississippi, consists of case files, correspondence, memoranda, and publications documenting a portion of his career as chief justice of the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit. The case files in this accretion primarily concern school districts in southern states; among the issues addressed is desegregation. Presented by Charles Clark, Jackson, Mississippi.

COURTLAND PLANTATION (ADAMS COUNTY, MISS.) JOURNAL. 1854-1855. 0.20 c.f.

This journal from Courtland plantation, Adams County, Mississippi, records slaves' names, daily tasks, amounts of cotton picked, and daily weather at the plantation from January, 1854, through the middle of July, 1855. Presented by Gale M. Butler, Jackson, Mississippi.

COURTLAND PLANTATION (ADAMS COUNTY, MISS.) JOURNAL. 1857-1859. 0.50 c.f.

This journal from Courtland plantation, Adams County, Mississippi, records slaves' names, daily tasks, amounts of cotton picked, and daily weather at the plantation from February, 1857, through the beginning of June, 1859. Presented by Charlotte Detillo, Olive Branch, Mississippi.

DAVIS (JEFFERSON) AND FAMILY PAPERS, ACCRETION. ca. 1869-1895. 0.20 c.f.

This accretion consists of four books. These include a copy of *The Veiled Doctor* by Varina Anne Jefferson Davis; a novel and a book of poetry by Richard Henry Savage; and a phrenology manual by O. S. Fowler containing a phrenological analysis of Jefferson Davis. Presented by Barbara P. Webb, Colorado Springs, Colorado.

DELAY FAMILY PAPERS. ca. 1852-1871. 0.50 c.f.

The papers include original correspondence, a will, and tintype photographs of members of the Delay family. The correspondence consists primarily of the letters of William Delay of Oxford, Mississippi, and his wife Kate, some of which were written during his service as a captain in the Confederate army during the Civil War. A letter to William Delay's son, Charles Douglas Delay, contains genealogical information on the family. Presented by Byron Howells, Birmingham, Alabama.

KING (W.) LETTER. 1850. 0.10 c.f.

This letter from W. King of Pontotoc, Mississippi, to his daughter, Mary Leonora King, in Red Sulphur Springs, Hardin County, Tennessee, contains information on the King family, friends, daily life, and farming activities at the family home in Pontotoc County, Mississippi. Presented by Michael Hennen, Jackson, Mississippi.

MONROE (GUSTAVUS L., JR.) DIPLOMATIC PAPERS. 1907-1911. 0.50 c.f.

These papers consist of correspondence, a special passport, and certificates of appointment concerning Gustavus L. Monroe, Jr., of Mississippi, who served as secretary of the United States legations at La Paz, Bolivia, and San Jose, Costa Rica, where he also served as chargé d'affaires. Several of these documents bear the signatures of United States presidents William Howard Taft and Theodore Roosevelt. Presented by Lorraine Wallach, Chicago, Illinois.

MUIRHEAD (JEAN DENMAN) PAPERS, ACCRETION. ca. 1988-1998. 1.83 c.f.

This accretion contains correspondence, photographs, social papers, programs, and newsclippings documenting the career of Mississippi state senator and judge Jean Denman Muirhead. There is considerable material in the collection concerning Muirhead's aunt, the poet Annie Denman, at that time resident in Jackson, Mississippi. These papers include correspondence from Denman, poems by her, and a photocopy of her book, *Voices In The Quiet Hour*. Presented by Jean Denman Muirhead, Falls Church, Virginia.

NEWCOMERS' CLUB (JACKSON, MISS.) RECORDS, ACCRETION. 1982-1998. 0.15 c.f.

This accretion consists of yearbooks and newsletters of the Newcomers' Club of Jackson, Mississippi. The yearbooks contain lists of officers, members, and copies of the club's constitution and by-laws, while the newsletters contain summaries of meetings, programs of club activities, and reports of club officers. Transferred from the library of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History, Jackson, Mississippi.

SWAIN (MARTHA) PAPERS. ca. 1976-1991. 0.10 c.f.

The papers of Martha Swain of Starkville, Mississippi, are composed principally of correspondence to her from Albert Y. Woodward, Jr., of Arlington, Virginia, concerning Swain's historical research and biography of Woodward's mother, Ellen Sullivan Woodward, of Oxford, Mississippi. Included with the correspondence are social papers, and a photocopy of an obituary of Albert Y. Woodward, Jr. Presented by Martha Swain, Starkville, Mississippi.

UNIDENTIFIED NATCHEZ, MISSISSIPPI, COLLECTION. ca. 1875-1908. 0.10 c.f.

This collection consists of a miscellany of materials salvaged from a bricked-up coal fireplace at 524 Franklin Street, Natchez, Mississippi. The collection includes photographs, postcards, an invitation, a receipt, and several advertisements. Presented by Lee Sturdivant, Natchez, Mississippi.

WINTER (WILLIAM F.) PAPERS, ACCRETION. ca. 1985-1998. 8.15 c.f.

This accretion to the papers of Mississippi governor William F. Winter includes files of correspondence, photographs, speeches, reports, programs, and publications. These materials document Winter's activities in several organizations concerned with the economic development of the South; his work on the President's Advisory Board on Race; and his service as president of the Board of Trustees of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History. BOYD-WALTERS-BOBO FAMILY PAPERS. 1852-1996. Eight volumes and 2.3 c.f.. Family, plantation scene, and riverside photographs, Civil War and World War I letters, records of the Concordia Masonic Lodge and the operation of Boyd Lane Plantation (Gunnison, Bolivar County, Miss.) and clippings relating to the life of James Ed Bobo.

PETER R. BRANTON PAPERS. 1889-1913. 7 vols. 0.1 c.f.

Records the establishment and operation of Peter R. Branton's plantation Isola, located near Leland, Miss. Includes transcribed correspondence between Branton and his parents in Virginia, discussing setting up the plantation, family news, and land sales. A time book, cotton receipt book, commissary and plantation ledgers and daybooks are also included.

CHARLES W. CAPPS, JR. PAPERS. 1955-1997. 0.3 c.f.. Correspondence, photographs, and clippings from Capps legislative career. Also included is a 1996 oral history with Capps.

HILL-CASSIBRY-SMITH FAMILY PAPERS. 1895-1964. 10 vols. and 0.6 c.f.. Letters, reports, clippings, and printed items relating to the Hill, Cassibry, and Smith families of Cleveland, Miss., pioneers of the town. Photographs, ledgers, letters, clippings, and ephemera, record early Cleveland businesses, service of Napoleon Cassibry, Sr., in World War I, establishment of Delta State Teachers' College, and the courtship of Ivy Graham and Edward Bibb Hill.

CROSSTIE ARTS COUNCIL RECORDS. 1974-1995. 5 c.f.

Minutes, correspondence, and photographs of the Crosstie Arts Council, an organization dedicated to promoting the arts in Bolivar County and the surrounding area, and which sponsors an annual arts festival.

JERRY DALLAS DELTA FARM COOPERATIVE COLLECTION. 1936-1956, 1986-1989. 0.3 c.f.. Includes newspaper clippings, pamphlets, magazine articles, correspondence, and interview notes gathered by DSU History Professor Jerry Dallas in researching his journal article about the Delta Farm and Providence Cooperatives. Also included is a photocopy of the farm's guest register, 1936-1941.

JOSEPH J. KING FAMILY PAPERS. ca. 1917-1950. 7 c.f. and approximately 20 vols. This collection records the operation of the King cotton and cattle plantation near Swan Lake, Miss., Tallahatchie County. Also included are letters from sons serving in World War II and items documenting King's involvement in local and civic affairs.

EUGENE LEFTWICH COLLECTION. 1846-1997. 5 c.f.. Clippings, ephemera, manuscript histories, photographs, and deeds recording Gunnison, Bolivar County, local families, churches, and organizations.

LUCY SOMERVILLE HOWORTH PAPERS. ca. 1920, 1935-1997. 5 c.f.. Personal and professional correspondence from her activities in Washington, D.C. in the thirties and forties, photographs, publications and ephemera from the AAUW and other women's groups, especially relating to women in the workforce during World War II and their return to domestic work after the war. Personal correspondence from her later years are also included, as are items relating to Monteagle, North Carolina, a church retreat camp.

RULEVILLE HOMETOWN MOVIES. ca. 1940. 1 VHS tape. Copy of home movies taken in downtown Ruleville on a Saturday, showing businesses, downtown scenes, and residents.

JANOS RADVANYI COLLECTION. 1947-present. ca. 8 c.f.. Papers, publications, and photos of Radvanyi, former diplomat in Communist Hungary who defected and is currently a retired History Department Faculty member at MSU. He is the first holder of the Radvanyi Chair in International Studies; he was the founder and director for 14 years of the MSU Strategic and International Security Center. Partially restricted.

CONGRESSIONAL COLLECTION: RUBEL L. PHILLIPS COLLECTION. 1950s-1980s. ca. 2 c.f. Correspondence, photos, and memorabilia of Phillips, pioneer in the modern Mississippi Republican Party. Restricted.

WILEY CARTER COLLECTION. 1930s-1990s. ca. 14 c.f.. Papers, photos, and memorabilia of Carter, deceased aide to Mississippi Senator Thad Cochran and Mississippi public servant in a variety of areas. Closed pending processing and consultation with family.

DAVID BOWEN COLLECTION, ACCRETION. 1970s-1990s. ca. 20 cu. ft.. Files, photos, campaign materials, memorabilia of Bowen, U. S. Congressman from Mississippi, Second District, 1973-1982; also items pertaining to Bowen's activities as a playwright. Collection open except for unprocessed material and case files.

G. V. "SONNY" MONTGOMERY COLLECTION, ACCRETION. 1980s-1990s.ca. 200 c.f.. Files, photos, memorabilia of Montgomery, U. S. Congressman from Mississippi, Third District, 1967-1997. Closed except for public series material, photos and memorabilia.
