Dr. Nico serves as an Assistant Professor of Interdisciplinary Studies at The University of Southern Mississippi with a focus on queer posthumanism, radical geography, quare ecology, spatial justice and BIPOC spiritual liberation.

T has worked as director of the Q Center at University of Washington and affiliate faculty, Associate Director of the Women and Gender Studies Resource Center at George Mason University, Education Equity Specialist at Oregon Department of Education focusing on Black Student Success, Researcher at the Multnomah County Environmental Health Department focusing on Health, Housing and Transportation as well as Western States Center focusing on organizer education and racial justice across sectors such as labor, philanthropy, community based organizations, etc.

They have been published in the Oregon Humanities, the International Journal of Qualitative Studies in Education, Cultural Studies ←→ Critical Methodologies, The Activist History Review, Journal of Homosexuality, and the Journal of Humanity and Society.
